

## ***Requirements for Civil Ceremony***

The following documents are all required by the Dominican Republic law to Foreigners Wishing to be legally married in the Dominican Republic.

- **Couples Certified Declaration of Single Status:** Couples statutory declarations will not be valid for more than three (3) months prior to your intended wedding date.  
Translated & Legalized by the Dominican Embassy or Consulate in your home country
- **Birth Certificates:** Couples birth certificates have to be translated & legalized by the Dominican Embassy or Consulate in your home country
- **Passports Photocopies:** Photocopy of Couple's & Witnesses' passport (2 witnesses) are required. The witnesses cannot be blood relatives.
- **Absolute Divorce Decree:** If either party has been divorced, then proof of absolute divorce decree is required with a court stamp. If the Bride has been divorced, then the absolute divorce decree must be issued at least 10 months prior to your intended wedding date. This is not applicable for gentleman.  
Translated & Legalized for the Dominican Embassy or Consulate in your home country
- **In case of Widow / Widower:** A death certificate of the ceased spouse is required with a copy of the Wedding Certificate Translated & Legalized by the Dominican Embassy or Consulate in your home country
